O Magnum Mysterium

Keep It light and cool

p. 8 m. 42 this line should be elegant & gracious with a lift between the A-naturals.

Sicut Locutus Est

Keep it dance like; don't emphasize every note

Domine Jesu

Tone: Bubbly, Warm and clear with some vibrato

Carefully observe Consonants & Dynamics

P 46 m 1-2 Keep it soft!

- p. 49 m. 27-29 even tone throughout the line.
 m. 28 practice intervals on “ca-dant” and “obs-cu-rum”
 p. 50 m. 44 forte but not heavy, keep it light“

Geographical Fugue

Mark & Practice dynamics and using lower voice

A Nightingale Sang in Berkeley Square

Reminder: “Sang” - stretch “Seh” and add the “ng” at last minute

“Nigh-TIN (no g)-gale

- p. 6 m. 36 Watch Ted as there is a ritard and a slight hold here.
 p. 7 m. 48-49 Practice interval E-flat to B-flat. (note that the first sopranos sing C in m 49, which is dissonant with our B-flat)

Sunday (Act 1 Finale from Sunday in the Park with George)

Basses sing lower staff, downward stems (except p 132, m 48-49)

- P 129 m 31 No syncope on “park”; it comes on the downbeat of measure 31
 (This is in contrast to p 132, m 50-51, where “park” comes on the last eighth note of m 50)
- p. 131, m. 42 Sing lower staff
 m. 43-46 Baritones and Basses split – Baritones sing upper line
- p 132 m 48-49 Sing top line that says “All men”
- p. 133, m. 62-63 Tenors sing (but not us)
 m. 64 All Basses, sing bottom line (with altos)
- p.134, m. 69 - end Basses sing bottom line, Baritones sing the middle line
 “Sunday” - diphthong (the ee of the y) is on the last beat of measures 70, 72, and 74.
